Mission Statement: Our overall goal is to provide the opportunity and support to help players find out how good they can be as individuals and as a team at something they have chosen as one of their favourite extracurricular activities. We believe that by taking this approach, we will create an environment where all the participants in the program will be set up for success, as they learn that the real competition is not with other players or even other teams, but with themselves. We believe that by enabling the players to develop themselves into strong baseball athletes, they will learn important life lessons that can be replicated in other parts of their lives and in the future.

Guiding Principles: Our objective is to approach the program in a manner consistent with the following themes:

- Fun! Structured. Variety of activities.
- Long-term Athlete Development (LTAD) model ABC's + P + MT
 - A = Agility; B = Balance; C = Coordination
 - P = Power; MT = Mental Toughness
- AAA and Select to be viewed as part of the same competitive baseball program over the long-term
- Reinforcing values the players are learning at home: respect; hard work; cooperation with others; striving for excellence; the importance of having a good time!
- Transparency
- Total team effort: players; coaches; parents; fans; NTBA
- Baseball as #1 sporting priority during outdoor season
- [Note that baseball is not expected to be the players' #1 sporting priority during the winter season. This is
 consistent with the LTAD model.]

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SUMMARY NOTES

- I. AAA and Select as a combined program
 - Recognizing that players develop and grow at different rates
 - Ensuring long-term health and success of the program
 - > Shared resources (coaching and professional instruction; facilities; practices) and equivalent training opportunities so there will be no structural development disadvantage at Select level
 - > Select players will be called-up as frequently as possible and try-outs will remain open each year to allow for certain players to play their way onto the AAA team

III. <u>Expectations</u>

- a. Volunteering
 - NTBA (North Toronto Baseball Association) is a volunteer organization (not pay-for-service), so this will only work properly if everyone chips in!
- b. July Break
 - > 8U/9U (2020/2021): 4 weeks
 - ▶ 10U and above: Guidance from NTBA: 2 weeks. Please read note below.
- c. Estimated fees and other expenses
 - Assuming we achieve similar sponsorship contributions as in 2019, team fees <\$2,000 per player
 - Note that there will be individual family expenses as well (uniforms; hotels; August baseball camp). See summary budget below.

Appendices

I. AAA and Select as a Combined Program

The AAA and Select teams will function as part of the same program over the long-term, rather than two largely disconnected teams. Players do not develop and grow at the same rate, so there will be opportunities for kids to play their way onto the AAA team, and the AAA team will utilize Select players as call-ups as frequently as possible. To ensure that this relationship functions properly over the long-term, the Select development path and training opportunities will be roughly consistent with those of the AAA teams. The implications of this approach include:

- The AAA teams and Select teams will share facilities.
 - For example, our winter training from late November April will consist of: (1) one weeknight session per week at Baseline Sports, a first-class indoor baseball training facility near Downsview Park (day/time TBD), and (2) practices in the Upper Canada College dome facility on every second Sunday from 7:30am 9:30am between late November mid-March (already booked).
 - These practices will be shared between the AAA and Select teams, with some of the activities being run together, and some of the activities being run separately, with each team using their half of the dome.
 - Option A: We are hoping to have the Baseline training for both teams running on the same night and at the same time as well, but this scheduling is handled by NTBA, so we will wait for confirmation. I have already requested that we be offered the same training times in adjacent spaces at Baseline.
 - Option B: If there are too many conflicts (especially with hockey), it may be better for the program to have these training sessions on different nights so that players can opt into a session that is more convenient. We will sort this out after the teams are selected in September.
- Professional coaching resources will be shared between AAA and Select.
- Coach Tim and Coach Randy will be Special Advisors to the Select team over the long-term, and we will choose
 and support the coaching staff.
- Uniforms will be identical to facilitate call-ups. AAA players will choose preferred numbers first, then Select players will choose preferred numbers so there is no overlap.
- Note that the Select team players will be expected to play in the NT House League system during the 8U (2020) and 9U (2021) years.
 - As of the 10U year (2022), it is expected that the Select team will declare as an "A" or "AA" team, and would then no longer participate in House League.

Combined AAA/Select Try-outs

- Both the AAA and Select teams will carry 13 players. Although traditionally 12-player rosters were the norm, there are new pitching rules coming in that require increased rest time for pitchers. Therefore, by the time our teams reach 10U in the 2022 season when pitching begins, we will need to develop more pitchers than in previous years, and therefore we need to develop more players in the earlier years.
- Try-outs for the AAA and Select teams will be held at the same time at the same location
 - The try-out schedule will proceed as follows (all sessions at Oriole Park: 201 Oriole Pkwy near Chaplin Crescent/Davisville and Yonge St.)
 - Day #1: Tuesday, September 3rd, 2019 @ 5:30pm 8:00pm
 - NHL Combine-style general physical fitness assessment (see details below)

- Day #2: Thursday, September 5th 5:30pm 8:00pm
 - Baseball skill assessments

First round of cuts

Day #3: Saturday, September 7th 6:00pm – 8:00pm

Final AAA and Select team selections made during the day on Sunday, September 8^{th} . Offers must be responded to on the same day, as we will need to offer spots to other players if necessary.

Try-out plan: Day #1

NHL Combine-style general physical fitness assessment (tentatively: Tuesday Sept 3, 2019 5:30pm-8:30pm)

Two stages with 6 stations per stage for a total of 12 stations/assessments, selected based on the following Long-term Development Athlete goals + Power + Mental Toughness:

ABC's = agility; balance; coordination; P = power; MT = mental toughness

Stage 1

- 1.1 Standing Vertical Jump [P]
- 1.2 65' timed sprint: 1 x to 1B; 1 x to 2B with slide (assess whether player slides properly) [S]
- 1.3 Accuracy throws (against the vertical board) [C]
- 1.4 Running long jump: no need to land balanced on two feet; feel free to fall/step forward after landing [P;A]
- 1.5 Agility run (zig zag run with pylons) [A]
- 1.6 Long balance walks (on the balance beams: 1 x straight walk; 1 x carrying something in front; 1 x carrying something in each hand to the side) [B]

Stage 2

- 2.1 Running vertical jump [P;A]
- 2.2 Juggling [C]
- 2.3 Hardest throw measured using radar gun [P;C]
- 2.4 Interview
- 2.5 Longest throw [P;C]
- 2.6 Standing long jump landing balanced on two feet [P;A;B]

Assistant coaches will also be rotated into different roles game-to-game.

In June, we will transition to a more competitive approach of determining lineups and positioning. We will try to find a couple of positions where we feel the kids will be most likely to succeed and will take the kids' interests into consideration. Coaches will be given permanent roles. > Batting order will be organized to maximize our team strengths > Batting order will be fluid – hard work at practice and at home by players trying to develop the proper technique and an aggressive attitude at the plate will be rewarded. Coachability is extremely important for the kids to develop proper technique. They really need to listen and be willing to make adjustments. > Baserunning will be a consideration re: batting order. Players that are consistently alert and aggressive on the base paths will benefit in the batting order. III. Expectations

Volunteering

- NTBA is a volunteer-driven organization. The league President, Treasurer, Board and Committee Members, Coaches, and Team Managers are all volunteers. All fees are used for the enhancement of the baseball program.
- Therefore, it is important to distinguish this volunteer organization from a pay-for-service business. With this perspective in mind, please understand that parents/guardians are expected to be engaged in this program in some way beyond fee payment. There are plenty of important opportunities to fulfill these commitments:
 - o Team Manager
 - Assistant Coach
 - Away-tournament organizers
 - Away-tournament food prep
 - O GameChanger data entry at games; preparing scouting reports for upcoming games based on data collected in GC on other teams through the season (and previous seasons!)
 - O Two convenors will be required in the 9U year (2021) when we host the Ontario Baseball Championships on Labour Day Weekend

July Break

- 8U (2020 season) and 9U (2021 season): AAA and Select: NTBA currently has a 4-week July break policy at the 8U and 9U age levels for AAA and Select. This policy is not expected to change, so we will also have a 4-week July break for both teams in 2020 and 2021. (Tentatively June 27 July 26, 2020)
- AAA from 10U: Once the kids start playing with pitching, the game changes dramatically and a long break shortly before TBA's can sabotage the whole season. Therefore, NTBA is moving toward a 2-week policy for the July break for AAA starting from the 10U age cohort. This will be our 2022 season. While we will not be completely inflexible on this issue, it's important that everyone understand why the association is moving in this direction, why I agree with this perspective, and why we should all plan to work together to follow this guidance.
 - At the 10U level with the introduction of pitching, it is not possible to maintain a high level of competitiveness in both batting and pitching terms after a 4-week break. In fact, the same is true of basic fielding as well.
 - The Toronto Baseball Championships (TBA's) are held in mid-August. Therefore, teams taking a long break may have only two weeks to regain form in order to compete in this tournament.
 - Performance at TBA's determines which teams go to the Ontario Baseball Championships (OBA's) on Labour Day Weekend. Achieving entry to the OBA's and having a chance to win it all is the main competitive goal of the entire season.
 - Note that this year, at the 10U AAA level, only the winner of TBA's (out of six teams) gets to go to OBA's.
 - The drop-off in performance for the 10U AAA team this year after the break was significant. In June, they were clearly one of the elite teams in the TBA. But then after the July month-long break, they came back and were easily "mercied" (beaten badly) by the two other elite teams in their league, neither of which takes more than two weeks off in July.
 - Here's what the drop looked like by the numbers (June vs. first two games back after a 4-week July break)

Team batting average: .363 dropped to .219
Hits per game: 9.6 down to 3.5
ERA: 4.8 up to 11

- Errors per game: 1.5 up to 5
- It just makes no sense to me to invest all of this time, effort, and money into winter training, and outdoor practices, tournaments, league games, development camps, and solo practice efforts, only to put the team into a position of clear weakness just before TBA's, with the season on the line.
- Select from 10U: As noted above, it is expected that the Select team would declare as either "A" or "AA" as of the 10U (2022) season. Even so, the guidance from the league is only for the AAA level at this time. Teams will need to decide on their own how to approach the July break. That said, it is really the rationale behind the NTBA guidance that is more important than the guidance itself. And since the Select TBA's are one week earlier than the AAA TBA's, the amount of time to recover from any performance drop will be even shorter.
- Note that there are expected to be numerous opportunities for Select call-ups to the AAA team in July.
